

Report of the activities Conducted by Literary Club

1)The Literary Club of our college organized various competitions related to the Anti-Drug Campaign to create awareness among the students. 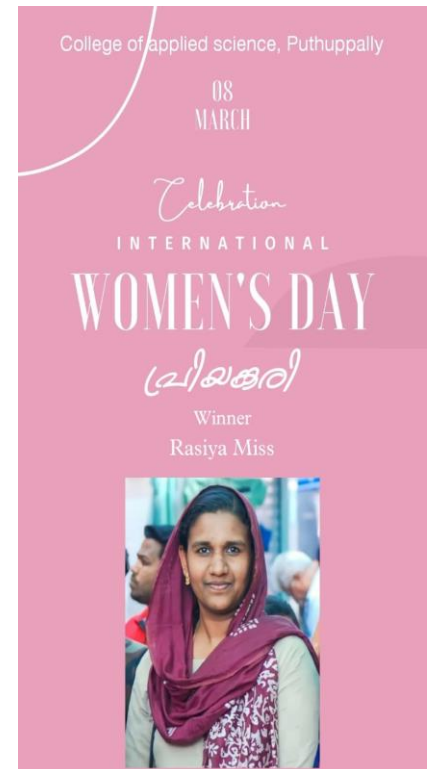
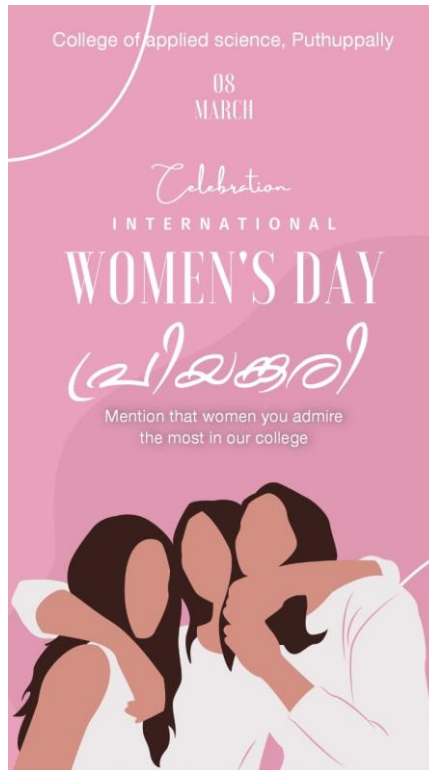
